Principal trumpet with the Montreal Symphony Orchestra since 1995, Merkelo is a 2016 Juno Award nominee for Classical Album of the Year, was ranked #1 in Quebec's classical recording chart in 2000, and in 2004 was nominated by the ADISQ for "Best Classical Album of the Year". Janelle Fung is a graduate of Eastman School, Juilliard and l'Université de Montréal. Winner of the 2014 BC Touring Council "Artist of the Year" and prize winner of the Concours OSM-Standard Life she has performed in over twenty countries and been featured on radio all over the world. Janelle is an active soloist and chamber musician and is on faculty at Highlands Opera Studio in Ontario.
